You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

What is this product?

Type This is a tax free savings plan with contributions of £25 per month payable for a term selected at commencement. The contributions are invested in the Foresters Friendly Society's with profits Order Insurance Fund. The term is selected at commencement and can vary from 10 to 25 years. The figures in this document are for a selected term of 10 years.

Objectives At the end of the selected term and providing all the contributions have been paid you are guaranteed to receive a tax free lump sum of at least 91% of the contributions paid which is £2,730 for a selected term of 10 years. Depending on the investment conditions, this minimum guaranteed value may be increased due to the possible addition of tax free yearly or final bonuses.

Intended retail investor Anyone aged between 16 and 80 who is not contributing to any other Friendly Society Tax Exempt Savings Plan and who is able to afford the regular monthly contribution of £25 for the selected term.

Insurance benefits This plan does not protect against the financial consequences of death.

 <p>The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for the selected term of 10 years. The actual risk may vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less.</p> <p>The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you. We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level, and poor market conditions are unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you. You are entitled to receive back at least 91% of your capital. Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on future market performance and is uncertain. However this protection against future market performance will not apply if you cash-in before your selected term (10 years) or fail to make your payments in time.</p> <p>If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment. Costs over time

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: The selected term (10 years)

The guarantee that you will receive back at least 91% of what you have paid in only applies if you keep the product for the full term you selected at commencement and make all the monthly payments as agreed when the product commenced.

There is no cash-in value for this product within the first year. If monthly payments cease in the first year the product lapses and nothing will be paid to you.
