What is this product

Type

With profits Child Tax Exempt Savings Plan.

Objectives

The plan aims to provide a child with a tax free cash sum at the end of a fixed term selected at commencement. By investing in the Foresters Friendly Society with profits Order Insurance Fund, we aim to add tax free bonuses to the minimum guaranteed maturity value on a yearly basis, with a possible additional bonus being paid at maturity, dependent on the performance of the fund. The addition of bonuses is not guaranteed.

Within the fund, your money is spread across a number of different types of investments including property, equities, cash and UK government bonds, to help minimise risk and increase the potential returns. You won't have to make any investment choices, as our expert fund managers manage the fund on your behalf.

Intended retail investor

Anyone can take out this plan for a child so long as they can afford the £25 monthly contribution for the chosen term. The child must be aged between 0 and 16 and must not have any other Friendly Society Tax Exempt Savings Plans. All contributions should be seen as a gift to the child and cannot be returned to the person who paid them.


Insurance benefits

This plan does not protect against the financial consequences of death. In the event of the child's death before the maturity of the plan, a refund of all contributions paid to date will be paid to their parent/guardian.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

Risk indicator





The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for the selected term of 15 years. The actual risk may vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level, and poor market conditions are unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

You are entitled to receive back at least 91% of your capital. Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on future market performance and is uncertain. However this protection against future market performance will not apply if you cashin before your selected term (15 years) or fail to make your payments in time.

If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment. However, you may benefit from a consumer protection scheme (see the section "what happens if we are unable to pay you"). The indicator shown above does not consider this protection.

What are the costs?

Costs over time

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs. The figures assume you invest £1,000 each year. The figures are estimates and may change in the future.

How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: The selected term (15 years)

The minimum guaranteed maturity value only applies if you keep the plan for the full term which you selected at commencement and you make all the monthly contributions during this time.

If you stop making contributions in the first year, the plan will lapse with no value which means nothing will be returned to the child. After the first year, if the plan is cashed-in or you stop paying contributions, the child may get back less than you have paid in.
